Dress Code

ABSENCES/ ATTENDANCE



Each child is expected to be punctual and at school. State Law requires students to attend school. In case of an absence from school, parents need to send a written excuse on the day their child returns describing the reason for their absence. The campus provides a form, if needed, on our website. If a child is absent five consecutive days or more, a doctor's excuse is required. Communication will be sent home by the district regarding absences. Adolphus has an Attendance Review Committee (ARC) that will review documentation regarding absences.

VISITORS

All visitors are required to sign in at the school office and present a valid ID.

All visitors must be:

Listed on Emergency Contact information.

If a visitor is not listed on Emergency Contact information, a parent/guardian will be contacted prior to admitting a visitor.

We welcome our parents/grandparents to come and eat lunch with their child(ren). Please follow all school procedures and sign in with the office for a visitor's pass. Visitors must stay in cafeteria and may not attend recess. Visitors need to sit with their child at the designated visitor tables. All visitors will be verified in Skyward as a parent or emergency contact unless accompanied by parent.



TRANSPORTATION CHANGES



- Best practice is to send a written note to the school with your child. Please do not email the teacher regarding the change since they are teaching during the day. <u>Transportation Change Note</u>
- If you need to make a last minute change, call the front office prior to 2:00 PM. 832-223-4700 Please do not email the teacher; they are busy teaching students.

MEDICATIONS



- All medication must be kept in nurse's clinic—this includes cough drops
- All medication must be in original container—if prescription, must have label with student's name and information on it
- All medication must be accompanied by appropriate paperwork—medication papers may be found on Adolphus website under nurse's note, or picked up from nurse (Nurse Kozak is also very willing to email you a copy for your convivence)
- Over the counter, short term medications, such as cough drops or antibiotics also need appropriate paperwork, which can also be found on website under nurse's notes and is called "Parental Permit to Administer Medication At School For 6 Weeks Or Less" –if unable to print this copy, you may send a dated note listing student's name, name of medication, reason for giving, time/frequency and duration that it is to be given—parent signature is also needed
- If your child has a life threatening allergy or asthma, please get with Nurse Kozak to discuss and provide appropriate paperwork and medication on campus for those "in case" moments for your child's safety.

PEANUT FREE CLASSROOMS

SPELLING

"If a student can spell a word, it is almost guaranteed they can read it."

We are adopting & using a curriculum called Scientific Spelling. Spelling & Phonics are now part of our daily ELA curriculum 1st-5th.

Purpose:

- Students will learn reliable patterns and rules of English language versus memorization. To help them solidify spelling patterns.

SPELLING ASSESSMENTS

The Power of Analysis

- Along with the adoption of Scientific Spelling we are now using Rubrics, rubrics are a better tool for evaluation, to analyze and guide further instruction.
 - 0 = a random string of letters is used, not all sounds are represented, or sounds are not in sequence [tk, thk, or tihkc for thick]
 - 1 = all sounds are marked but two or more letters are not reasonable representations of the sounds or extraneous letters are added [theg or fek for thick; theitchk for thick]
 - 2 = all sounds are marked but one letter is not a reasonable representation of a sound [tik or thek for thick]
 - 3 = all sounds are marked with reasonable representations [thik or thic for thick]
 - 4 = the spelling seems conventional, but an unnecessary letter is added or doubled [thicke or thickk for thick]
 - 5 = correct spelling



Children feel more accomplished because of this evaluation system





DREAMBOX

 Dreambox is a math learning environment that adapts to your student's needs.

• Students see practice units and lessons dependent on how they perform on assessments.



DreamBox

GRADING GUIDELINES

- Reading, Language Arts (Writing), Math, Science, Social Studies
- A minimum of 8 minor grades will be taken each nine weeks.
- A minimum of 2 major grades will be taken each nine weeks.
- The report card grade will reflect a weight of 70% minor grades and 30% major grades.





REASSESSMENT GUIDELINES



- A teacher shall provide corrective instruction and a reasonable opportunity to reassess failure to master TEKS on major grades. The highest possible grade that can be earned and recorded on the reassessment is a 70. The teacher will make a note in the electronic gradebook of the dates and grades of the reassessment.
 - -Minor grades are not subject to reassessment guidelines.
 - -District exams are not subject to the reassessment guidelines.
 - -Compositions and student projects are not subject to reassessment guidelines.

MAJOR GRADES

• There will be teacher created social studies, science, writing, reading, and math major grades.

• In order to better prepare your child, please keep all graded work to review

prior to the nine weeks test.

Students will be expected to build, read, and answer questions from a bar graph and a pictograph. *Pictographs- reading the "key" is important*

Probability

Students will be expected to answer questions with various outcomes. Key Vocab: More likely, less likely, impossible, or certain



- If the box is blank, there were no behavior concerns during the day 😊


